News from Marian Valley

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Since the last newsletter, a lot has happened here at Marian Valley, as well as within the Pauline Order in Australia.

Firstly, the appointments for the Australian Province have been finalised for the placements of the Pauline Fathers and Brothers for the next 3 years which will take effect during May 2015. I have been appointed to Dromana Parish in Melbourne as of 8th May 2015. I will be sad to leave Marian Valley as I have met so many wonderful people.

Brother Luke has also been transferred after 9 years at Marian Valley. Br Luke will be going to Penrose Park, NSW.

Provincial Administrator: Fr Peter James Strohmayer



Ukrainian Chapel Opening

On Monday 29th September 2014, the Ukrainian Catholic Chapel of the Protection of the Mother of God was opened and blessed by His Beatitude, Patriarch Sviatoslav Shevchuk. The Patriarch was accompanied by Bishop Peter Stasiuk CssR, Eparch for Australia, New Zealand and Oceania. Around 80 people attended the opening.

Patriarch Sviatoslav is Head of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church and visited all major Ukrainian parishes during his Australian Patriarchal tour over a 2 week period in September 2014. There are a total of 50 Ukrainian Greek Catholic bishops

APOSTLES OF THE DIVINE MERCY

Now that the feast day of Divine Mercy is coming close I would like to bring to the attention of the readers of Mary's Rose that here at Marian Valley we have a very dedicated group called "the Apostles of the Divine Mercy".

This group who meet on Tuesday each week was started by Fr. Andrew Dembecki OSPPE around 1998 with the aim to study St. Faustina's diary in order to learn and better understand the infinite Mercy of God.

Each Tuesday after Holy Mass we start with the Divine Mercy Chaplet and after a brief coffee break we go to the meeting room. We start the meeting with some prayers and then read about 5 pages of the diary. We then discuss and listen and share our findings and thoughts. We follow a study guide which points to the appropriate lessons from the bible and the catechism.

We are very blessed to have Fr. Anthony David OSPPE as our spiritual director. He enlightens us when we get stuck on a certain topic. We have come to understand that the most important thing about the Divine Mercy message is the saving of souls by means of TRUST in the Lord and saying the Chaplet. After the meeting, we all spend some quality time in the Adoration Chapel.

We invite anyone who is interested, to sit in on one or more of our meetings and then to try to start a group in your own parish or even at home.

Our program each Tuesday is: 8.40am Rosary. 9am Mass followed by Divine Mercy Chaplet. Morning tea. Prayers and reflection. Adoration. All Welcome
