In November 2016, the Pauline Fathers announced appointments for the Province of Australia. I am pleased to say that effective from 7th November 2016, I was appointed the Rector of the Shrine of Our Lady Help of Christians, Marian Valley. I am very happy to accept this position and am looking forward to continuing on the great work that is happening here at Marian Valley, Canungra.

I have also been appointed the Prefect for the Newly Ordained Priests and Brothers, as well as Vicar Provincial of the Order in Australia. Fr Anthony David OSPPE and Br Bruno Kanamis OSPPE will continue on in their positions, assisting me at Marian Valley.

As many of you are aware, this year we celebrate the 100th anniversary of Fatima. We have always celebrated Fatima day on the 13th of each month here at Marian Valley, so this will be a very special year for us all. On the 13th May and the 13th October we will be inviting special guests to be the main celebrants for the Mass.

Less known in Australia, but a very significant event for our Order and in the Motherland of Poland, is the celebration of the 300th anniversary of the Coronation of Our Lady of Jasna Gora, recalling the event in 1717 when the first outside of Rome coronation of Our Lady of Czestochowa took place.

For this year, I have decided to introduce the 'Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament' before the 11am Mass each Sunday. Exposition will be one hour before Mass, starting at 10am. It is already encouraging to see a number of pilgrims supporting this beautiful sacrament since starting on Sunday 5th February.

There are many other events which we are looking forward to here at Marian Valley. On Divine Mercy Sunday 23 April, the main celebrant will be His Excellency, Most Rev. Adolfo Tito Yilana, the Apostolic Nuncio in Australia. On the Feast of Our Lady Help of Christians, Patroness of Australia, the main celebrant will be Most Rev. Mark Coleridge, Archbishop of Brisbane which will be held on Saturday 20th May. On Our Lady's birthday, held on Saturday 2nd September, Bishop Columba Macbeth-Green OSPPE will once again be our main celebrant. So as you can see, some wonderful feast days are being planned for this year.

Lourdes Day

On Saturday 11th February, around 300 pilgrims made the journey to Marian Valley for the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. This day is a special day for the sick and elderly. Buses came from the Gold Coast and Toowoomba. The afternoon session included a Eucharistic procession to Our Lady of Lourdes Grotto, followed by benediction and blessing of each person present with the Blessed Sacrament. A big thank you to Fr Jan Bialasiewicz, Fr Stephen O'Shea and Fr Anthony David OSPPE for spending hours in the heat to provide confession.

Fr Andrew Dembicki OSPPE

The main celebrant for the Healing Mass was Fr Andrew Joachim Dembicki OSPPE, Rector of Divine Mercy Shrine in Cairns and former Prior of Marian Valley from June 1996 – March 2006. Fr Andrew gave an inspiring homily, and in the afternoon session he gave a spiritual talk. At 3pm he led the singing of the Divine Mercy Chaplet. Pilgrims were delighted that he still had his wonderful singing voice and gift of speech.

As background, Fr Andrew Dembicki OSPPE spent 20 years as a Chaplain in the US Army and was a Lieutenant Colonel.

In 1996, following his retirement, Fr Augustine Lazur OSPPE, founder of the Order in Australia, invited Fr Andrew OSPPE to help set up the Shrine at Marian Valley. For 10 years he worked tirelessly, and successfully established Marian Valley as one of the most significant Shrines in Australia.

In 2006, Fr Andrew OSPPE was transferred to Rome where he was the Prefect of the Pauline Order House for 7 years. He then took on another challenge of setting up an additional Shrine in Australia. This time it was in the Cairns Diocese. On 2 February 2014, The Shrine of Divine Mercy and Immaculate Heart of Mary at Mercy Valley near Mareeba was opened and blessed by Most Rev. James Foley DD DPh. Bishop of Cairns.

Sadly, in May this year, Fr Andrew will be leaving Australia and returning to Rome to continue his ministry with the Pauline Fathers. We wish him the best in his new venture.

IMMACULATE Conception

Vale: Ray Calebretta

On Thursday 19 January 2017, Ray (Raffaele) Calebretta passed away aged 86 years. Born in Giarre, Sicily on 14 March 1930, Ray came to Canungra to live and to be part of the Marian Valley community around 17 years ago. He participated with the volunteers to help build the Workshop and the Retreat Centre. He financed and installed the processional PA system to the Fatima Grotto.

Ray was a member of the Divine Mercy group for many years. He consistently spent hours in the Adoration Chapel and was one of the loyal volunteers on the daily Adoration roster. In later years, he still continued with help from Basil.

Ray donated The Gabriel Express (yellow buggy) to the Pauline Fathers mainly to assist Fr Gabriel to get around Marian Valley. He donated the buggy on behalf of his 3 children, Chris, Rhonda and Mark. The plaque is still on the steering wheel.



Ray loved to teach the young and the old the Catholic faith, and was a Catechist at the Canungra State School for many years. His main project in the past few years has been the recording of Catholic programs on DVDs and the distribution of hundreds of DVDs free of charge.

Being an Italian, he loved to cook pasta dishes and would often leave a big lasagne dish at the monastery or whenever there was an important occasion at Marian Valley.

Over a lifetime, Ray developed a great clarity and wisdom on how to lead a good Christian life. He will be greatly missed. May he rest in peace.

300 Year Anniversary of Coronation

This year, the Order of St Paul the First Hermit is planning big celebrations for the 300th anniversary of the Coronation of the Miraculous Image of Our Lady of Czestochowa with Papal crowns.

In 1215, the Order was founded in Hungary and spread rapidly throughout Hungary and then into Croatia, Germany, Poland, Austria and Bohemia. A highlight in the Order's history took place in 1382 when they became the custodians of the miraculous icon of Our Lady 'The Black Madonna', believed to be painted by St Luke the Evangelist.

The Icon was brought to Poland by Ladislaus, Duke of Opole, from a castle at Belz, in modern day Ukraine. The monks established a shrine for the venerable image of the Blessed Mother in the small town of Czestochowa. Today, this shrine is the Mother house of the Order, with over 100 Fathers and Brothers.

Although Our Lady of Czestochowa was made "Queen and Protector of Poland" by King John II Casimir in 1652, its first canonical coronation was by Clement XI on 8 September 1717, which is the date of the anniversary. Additional coronations of the image were also issued by St. Pius X on 22 May 1910 and St. John Paul II on 26 August 2005.

A Canonical Coronation is a pious institutional act, wherein the Pope designates a crown or stellar halo be added to a Marian image under a specific devotional title in a particular area or diocese. The crowning of Our Lady of Czestochowa was the first such coronation to take place outside of Rome.

In a resolution adopted on 15 December 2016, the Polish Parliament called "the image of the Mother of God at Jasna Góra ... one of the most important religious and material national treasures."

Although Jasna Gora is a Roman Catholic monastery, the Black Madonna has a strong following among Orthodox believers in both Ukraine and Belarus. Jasna Gora is the most well-known and popular shrine in Poland, with around 3.5 million pilgrims visiting from around the world last year.

The special 2017 commemorations will culminate on 26 August, the feast day of the image.

A copy of the Black Madonna of Czestochowa is housed in the Black Madonna Chapel at Marian Valley. It was first housed at Tamborine Mountain, and then transferred to Marian Valley when the Pauline Fathers relocated in 1995.
