

News from 'Marian Valley'

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In this Year of Mercy, it is wonderful to see so many pilgrims visiting Marian Valley from many places around the world. Marian Valley is certainly a place of peace and prayer.

Currently, I am Acting Prior at Marian Valley, and assisted by Br Bruno Kanamis OSPPE. On 7th June 2016, Fr Oskar Osinski and Fr Michael Szymanski resigned and relocated to the Cairns diocese to take up the role of parish priest at North Cairns Parish and Mossman/Port Douglas Parish respectively. We wish them well in their new roles.

At Marian Valley, there are many volunteers who assist in a variety of roles. Pilgrims often comment on the many aspects of Marian Valley which are taken care of by Volunteers: the beautiful manicured lawns and gardens; the clean facilities; the Piety Shop; the Retreat Centre; the beautiful choir and music; Sacristy work; the vast maintenance work; the History department; and most importantly, looking after the needs of pilgrims that come here each day. Our wonderful volunteers do their good works for God through the hands of the Blessed Virgin Mary. A big thank you to all the Volunteers.

In the past few months we have had some very special guests visit Marian Valley. In May, Most Reverend Robert McGuckin, Bishop of Toowoomba Diocese, was the main celebrant for the mass of Our Lady Help of Christians. On 15th August, for the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the main celebrant was Fr Declan Gibson from the Missionaries of the Most Holy Eucharist. This Order is based in France. For Our Lady's birthday on Saturday 3rd September, we were once again privileged to have as the main celebrant, Most Reverend Columba Macbeth-Green OSPPE, Bishop of Wilcannia-Forbes Diocese.

As already mentioned, we have been very busy here at Marian Valley welcoming many of the schools, parishes and prayer groups in this Year of Mercy. Next year is looking just as busy. The Year 2017 marks the 100th anniversary of Our Lady appearing at Fatima. From the words of Sr Lucia, "Our Lady said Pray, pray a great deal and make many sacrifices, for many souls go to Hell because they have no one to make sacrifices and to pray for them".



VOLUNTEERS

A common remark that you hear around Marian Valley is, "Where would we be without the Volunteers?" Many charity organisations struggle to get volunteers. We are very fortunate to have a small, but strong band of volunteers who work tirelessly each day at Marian Valley. Amazingly, there are no paid staff. This greatly benefits the Pauline community, allowing money to be put into various projects.

Pilgrims love visiting the Piety Shop, which is always stocked to the brim with pious merchandise and excellent Catholic books. Often pilgrims love it so much at Marian Valley they will book themselves in for a stay at the Retreat Cabins. The peaceful surroundings are a major attraction for many pilgrims. The beauty of Marian Valley is aided by the many volunteers who put in long hours to keep the place going.

Hospitality is an integral part of the pilgrim's experience, especially when visitors come from many different places around Australia and all over the world. Most of the volunteers have been at Marian Valley for many years and are able to entertain pilgrims with both historical information and a spiritual experience. A comment from one of the veteran volunteers, Tony Ryan said, "So many pilgrims are fascinated with the stories that we tell about Marian Valley. I love seeing the pilgrims happy."

The latest major project at Marian Valley has been the upgrade of the sewerage system. Part of the project required laying 500 metres of pipes underground. Overseen by an Environmental Operations Operator and an Engineer, the Volunteers were able to carry out this major project using their own machinery, including an excavator and tractor, thus saving Marian Valley tens of thousands of dollars. Amazingly, the project was finished well ahead of the scheduled completion date.

It was also the annual pilgrimage of the Polish community, celebrating the Feast of Our Lady of Czestochowa, with their Chaplain Fr Andrzej Kolaczowski from Our Lady of Victories Church, Bowen Hills. Around 300 pilgrims attended the combined Fatima/Polish Day.

Our Lady's Birthday

On Saturday 3 September, Bishop Columba Macbeth-Green OSPPE celebrated the holy mass for Our Lady's birthday, joined by several concelebrants from the Brisbane and Cairns Diocese.

Around 800 pilgrims attended the mass. Busses came from the Gold Coast, Ipswich, Toowoomba, Hervey Bay, Brisbane Central, Moorooka/Salisbury and Stafford.

The afternoon program included a Eucharistic procession to the Grotto of Our Lady of Fatima, rosary, devotions and benediction, and concluded with the Divine Mercy Chaplet.

Miraculously there was no rain, even though all week the media was predicting rain for Saturday. Word among the pilgrims is Fr Anthony's prayers had something to do with this miracle.

Bishop Columba OSPPE left early in the afternoon, as he had a 12 hour trip to His Diocesan Parish of Bourke to celebrate a Mass of thanksgiving the next day, to coincide with the canonisation of Saint Teresa of Kolkata in Rome. Bourke was the place of the first Missionary of Charity House in Australia, opened by the then Mother Teresa of Kolkata herself in 1969. On Sunday 4th September, more than 200 people attended the Mass at Bourke with Bishop Columba and the Missionary of Charity Sisters.

The first mass in Queensland by the Pauline Fathers for Our Lady's birthday was celebrated 27 years ago at Tamborine Mountain on 8th September 1989.

Margaret and Bern Foley, who are now both deceased, spread the Devotion of Praying the Rosary as a gift to Our Blessed Mother on Her Birthday, not only in Australia, but around the world. As a result, we join with countless millions around the globe to offer our prayers for world peace.

From the beginning, the Universal Rosary Bouquet has had a connection to Marian Valley and the Pauline Fathers. This wonderful devotion has truly been a powerful prayer in spreading the Rosary throughout many countries, in Honour of Our Blessed Mother.

YEAR OF MERCY INDULGENCE

Pope Francis declared a Plenary Indulgence for the Year of Mercy for those who make a pilgrimage to the Door of Mercy, attend confession, attend mass and recite prayers. The Holy Year of Mercy is being celebrated from 8 December 2015 (Immaculate Conception) to 20 November 2016 (Christ the King).

In February 2016, Archbishop of Brisbane, Most Rev. Mark Coleridge announced that Marian Valley was to be a place of pilgrimage for this Year of Mercy. The six pilgrimage churches of mercy in the Brisbane Archdiocese include the Cathedral, Red Hill, Clear Island Waters, Nambour, Annerley and Ipswich.



Vale - Marjorie Liddy

It was with great sadness to hear that Marjorie Liddy passed away on Wednesday 24 August 2016 en route to the Tiwi Islands, returning home from priestly ordinations in Melbourne. Marjorie, mother of 12, an Indigenous Catholic woman, was the person behind the design of the priest's chasubles for the papal mass at Sydney's 2008 World Youth Day. On the back of the chasuble is an image commonly called Marjorie's Bird.

Many people will remember Marjorie when she visited Marian Valley in June 2014, accompanied by fellow Tiwi Islander people. With bare feet and a Blessed Virgin Mary t-shirt, Marjorie and her fellow Islanders performed a spiritual dance at Marian Valley at the conclusion of Mass. Marjorie was a quiet, gentle woman, who claimed she received extraordinary gifts from the Holy Spirit.



In Marjorie's words: "Open your hearts. Let Him in. Let Him in. He will help you to know and understand Mother Mary and Jesus. There's so much love the Lord has for us. So much love. He wants us all to love him. To go back – to go to Mass, go to confession, and receive Him. And our love will grow, grow.
