Dear Beloved Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

### **HAPPY EASTER DEAR PILGRIMS!**

The Shrine of Our Lady Help of Christians has been so busy and full of life with our pilgrims this year. We have recently been celebrating with much solemnity the Sacred Triduum, The Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Divine Mercy Sunday, and the continuation of the Pashal mysteries throughout the season of Easter. We invite all who can to come join us! No doubt Pentecost will be a joyful feast as will the continued celebrations of all the Saints. For those who at this time cannot join us physically, we ask to be joined in your prayers.

Our attention is now turned to the Celebration of Mary, the Most Holy Mother of God, Our Mother, under that treasured title which is so familiar to us: Help of Christians. But what does this title Help of Christians mean? Well, let history be our teacher always.

For centuries, the Ottoman Empire and forces of Islam terrorised the ports and cities of the Mediterranean. Piracy, Forced Slavery, Senseless Murder, and even worse atrocities were committed everyday against the People of God and his Saints. The Holy Father, Pope St. Pius V, put out a call to all the Princes of Christendom to form a final "last-ditch" effort to stop the pillaging mayhems and carnage running rampant against the faithful by the Turk. In all, only nine princes adhered to the call of Rome. This assemblage of nobles and men, under the command of a twenty-four-year-old Don Juan of Austria, were named The Holy League. The Pope begged all Christians, even Protestants, to entrust the endeavour by this Holy League to the protection and intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary by praying the Rosary. More than seventy thousand men of the Spanish Empire, the various Italian Republics, Greek Rebels, Sovereign Military Orders, and the Papal States would clash with the far more superior, countless, and experienced ships and sailors of the Ottoman Navy stationed off a little rocky outcrop in modern day Greece known to us today as Lepanto.

At the dawning of the 7th of October 1571, the rough and worn hands of sailors and soldiers that had been praying the most Holy Rosary throughout night, now placed their holy beads down, and accepted the oars and sails of their galleys and, going forth, rowed into the din of battle. By dusk, the forces of Christendom had achieved a crushing victory. One remarkable outcome was that twenty thousand Christian galley slaves were liberated from the Turk and restored to their homes. Because of this combined moral and military victory, the Holy Father inserted the title "Help of Christians" into the Litany of Our Lady, as he knew that the threat of invasion had been averted through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Our Lady again was invoked under the title of Help of Christians early in the 19th century. When Pope Pius VII ascended to the papacy in 1800, shortly after Napoleon rose to power in France, he resisted many attempts by Napoleon to diminish the authority and life of the Church. As a result, Napoleon confined him and prohibited the Cardinals and Prelates from meeting him. Around the world Catholics prayed to secure the Pope's freedom, chiefly to allow him to fulfill his Papal duties. 1814 saw his freedom, his liberty being attributed to Our Lady, Help of Christians, it was decided that the anniversary of his return to Rome, May 24th, would be chosen as a new feast day in her honour.

The invocation of Mary as Help of Christians is ancient with one of the oldest prayers directly addressed to her known as the Sub Tuum Praesidium (Under your Protection), which was found on a third century papyrus from Egypt. 1844 saw the BVM under the title of Our Lady Help of Christians as Major Patroness of Australia at the First Provincial Synod of Sydney, chosen by the Bishops in Australia. We continue to pray for all our needs, the needs of our pilgrims, the needs of our home Australia, but we never forget our brothers and sisters in the Faith being persecuted around the world for their fidelity to Our Lord Jesus Christ, his Blessed Mother, and all the Angels and Saints. Let us be ever thankful for the blessings which God bestows on us in this land of ours and let us, through the hand of his Most Holy Mother, continue to give him the Glory, AMEN!

#### THE HOLY ROSARY

Rosary

On 7 October, the Roman Catholic Church celebrates the annual feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. The feast day takes place in honour of the naval victory on 7 October 1571, which secured Europe against Turkish invasion, known as the battle of Lepanto. Pope St. Pius V attributed the victory to the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

The Rosary is a powerful weapon against evil, vice, sin and heresies, and a protection against misfortune and death.

St Louis De Montfort said, "The word Rosary means 'Crown of Roses,' that is to say that every time people say the Rosary devoutly, they place a crown of one hundred and fifty-three red roses and sixteen white roses upon the heads of Jesus and Mary," and "Being heavenly flowers these roses will never fade or lose their exquisite beauty."

# **ST DON BOSCO RELIC VISIT**

On Sunday 22 October 2023, Marian Valley was privileged to host the relic of St Don Bosco. Around 450 pilgrims came to venerate the relic.

At 9am many pilgrims were present to greet the arrival of the St Don Bosco relic. At 10am there was Exposition, Rosary and Divine Mercy Chaplet. At the I Iam mass Fr William Matthews, the Salesian Provincial, was the main celebrant. Another Salesian priest, Fr Elson Barretto concelebrated the mass, which was followed by Exposition and Divine Mercy devotions.

At Ipm, Br Stan Rosato, a Salesian Brother who, with Fr William, accompanied the relic on the tour of Australia, gave an interesting question & answer session. The relic was also present at the 4pm mass.

From 9am to the conclusion at 6pm, it was amazing to see so many pilgrims reverently venerating the St Don Bosco relic continuously all day.

### **ST DON BOSCO RELIC**

The relic statue of St John Bosco, better known as St Don Bosco, toured Australia as part of the celebrations of the centenary of the arrival of the Salesians

on Australian soil. The Salesians landed in Western Australia at Fremantle on 30 March 1923.

The wax replica of the saint is contained in a 450 kilogram glass casket and comes from the Salesian Province in Hong Kong, where it was made at the time of Don Bosco's beatification in 1929. A small piece of brain from the saint was removed and placed in this wax replica before being securely concealed in the large glass casket.




**Relic of St Don Bosco** 

St Don Bosco Don Bosco was born on 16 August 1815, in Becchi, Italy. He dedicated his life to helping young people to become "good Christians and upright citizens." He founded the Salesian Society, named after St Francis de Sales.

In one of his dreams, he heard it said to him, "Not with blows, but with charity and gentleness must you draw these friends to the path of virtue." He took this dream as his life's mission.

His most famous dream regards future troubles for the Church and is known as the Prophecy of the Two Columns. In St Don Bosco's words, "Only two things can save us in such a grave hour: devotion to Mary and frequent Communion."



At the time of Don Bosco's death, 31 January 1888, there were 250 homes for boys founded by the Salesian Society containing 130,000 children; of these, over 6,000 became priests. The Salesian Society is the 2nd largest religious order in the world.

St Don Bosco was canonized on Easter Sunday, I April 1934 by Pope Pius XI. His feast day is 31 January.

## STORM DAMAGE

On Sunday 24 December 2023, the 4th Sunday of Advent, Fr Zachary Lewis was celebrating the 11am mass. He had just begun his homily when there was a tremendous gush of wind. The power went off, and the rain pelted down.

Fr Zachary calmly continued on with the mass, and being the 4th Sunday of the month, still had Exposition, Divine Mercy Chaplet and Benediction at the end of mass. The storm did not interrupt the usual Sunday mass program.

During all this time, it was terrifying to hear large trees cracking and falling in the hills, and it was impossible for anyone to venture outside the church for over an hour.

#### **RECOVERY TEAM**

A couple of days later, once the weather had cleared, a group of volunteers came to clear the grounds and repair the damaged statues. Many large trees and bushes had twisted and fallen in the cyclonic-type winds. Around 20 tonnes of fallen trees and debris was collected.

It took 2 weeks for Energex to restore power in the local Canungra district, but fortunately Marian Valley had backup power from a diesel generator.

#### THE MESSAGE STICK

On Friday 8 December, Marian Valley received the Message Stick from Fr Janusz Pawlicha from the Nerang Parish. The Message Stick was travelling around the Archdiocese of Brisbane, and is part of St Stephen's Cathedral 150 years celebrations. The Cathedral was solemnly blessed and dedicated on Sunday 17 May 1874.

### IMMACULATE CONCEPTION
